

Kombi Overview:

Found in Prospect Hill, South Australia, this rare and unique VW has spent the last decade sitting idle in the back lot of a rural farm allotment. Built in 1972, the Kombi was the pinnacle of adventure and excitement when it came to camping and exploring, and to this day remains one of the most iconic vehicles on the road – coveted by enthusiasts and collectors.

This example appears to have found its way to Adelaide hills from Victoria before its retirement to the farm. Inspection shows the mechanical drive-line to be intact, and in potentially serviceable condition. The identification numbers reveal the engine is a twin-port 1.6L flat four cylinder, coupled to a heavy duty Kombi 4-speed gearbox. After coming to a rest at the farm, estimates have put the Kombi spending anywhere up to 10 years enjoying the hilltop climate that the South Australian Fleurieu Peninsula has to offer.

This particular Kombi has a distinctive single roof opening for its camper status, and also has a unique green paint/red trim combination. Inside, there are the factory bucket seats, and multi-gauge layout, with the odometer unable to be verified.

This is a rare and exciting automotive archaeological find. A snap shot of what adventure looked like some 49 years ago, and a super rare opportunity to secure a vehicle that has universal appeal and verified investment potential.

Full restoration is required, with the vehicle currently in a complete rolling, non running state.
